Immanuel Lutheran Church Celebrates 150th Anniversary


This month, Immanuel Lutheran Church celebrates the 150th anniversary of its founding.

In 1867, German Lutherans in Boone County began to congregate and hold worship services and were served by various visiting pastors from the Chicago area. On November 21, 1869, the congregation was organized as the "deutsche evangelische lutherisch Immanuels Germeinde U.A.C." under the leadership of their first resident pastor, the Rev. Philip Estel. Worship services were initially held in the Boone County Courthouse, and later in the home of John Suhr.

In 1875, the Belvidere Lutherans purchased the property and building of the Congregational Church, located at Main and Church Streets. After some renovation including a steeple addition, the building was dedicated as a Lutheran church in July of 1875.

During 1893, the congregation purchased three lots on West Boone Street for \$1000. Plans were soon underway to erect a new house of worship on the newly acquired property. The old church on the south side was sold and services temporarily were held in the old Methodist church until the new building was completed. The large, stately, white frame German-Gothic church had a towering steeple that was visible for miles. It was dedicated October 15, 1893, and was completed at a cost of \$5,970.

At the turn of the century, Immanuel, then known as "the German Lutherans" or "the Boone Street Germans", was growing into a large congregation – and thriving. In 1906 a new, two-story brick school building was built next to the church for a cost of \$6,000. It served well until World War I, when enrollment dwindled. In 1920, the school closed for lack of students; however, it continued to be used as a church fellowship hall, Sunday school and youth area.

A big wave of growth took place in the post-World War II years. A church basement was dug in 1951, and the school was re-opened in 1953. In 1956, twenty-six acres of property on Second Street were purchased for \$30,000. In 1958, a new \$210,000 school was built.

On April 21, 1967, a violet EF4 tornado whipped across northern Illinois, barreling into Belvidere and leaving a path of death and destruction. Immanuel Lutheran School had been dismissed, but many students remained waiting for their bus. The children were gathered and brought into the basement of the school where together they sang "Jesus Loves Me". Everyone on Immanuel's campus was spared, however, one of Immanuel's own, Becky Vogelsong, lost her life on one of the buses that was at the high school. Immanuel's own school was heavily damaged. Three of the four classrooms in the corner were destroyed, and the southern part of the gym roof was taken. The community pulled together during this tragic time. While the school was being repaired, classes were held at the Covenant Church and at the old school located by the church on Boone Street. Classes resumed in the repaired school in the fall of 1967.

In 1996, Immanuel built a new church facility at the school location, a \$3 million sanctuary and parish fellowship center, thereby ending 103 years of history on Boone Street. A "Worship as One" service was held on October 21, 2012 at Belvidere North High School at which the mortgage was burned.

In 1997, the church purchased a home on the corner of Second Street and Belvidere Road that was extensively remodeled. This building, now called CrownPoint, houses the Helping Hand's offices and their Paper Closet.

Immanuel North held its "grand opening" on October 23, 2010. It is located in a strip mall on Illinois Route 173, and serves many needs in the Northern Boone County area. In addition to Sunday morning services, the "North" members engage in many service projects helping people in the North Boone community area. Pastor Rick Wagner is the North Campus Pastor.

The Belvidere congregation is currently served by Rev. Roger Pollock, Interim Senior Pastor and Rev. Keith Richard, Assistant Pastor. The previous Senior Pastor, Rev. Allan Buss, was elected to be President of the Northern Illinois District of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod in March of 2018. President Buss assumed his role in May of 2018. Immanuel is currently searching for a Senior Pastor to replace Rev. Buss

In September 2018, Immanuel began a year-long celebration of its 150 years of ministry. The celebration began with weekend services preached by Rev. Charlie Blakey, a former member of Immanuel before attending Seminary. Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison, President of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, preached at Immanuel's Legacy Weekend Services on September 21 and 22, 2019.

The final celebration was held on Sunday November 10 in the gymnasium at Belvidere North High School. Rev. Allan Buss preached to over 1100 people in the gymnasium of the high school. Special music was provided by the Concordia Chicago College Wind Symphony, Children's Choir, Adult Choir, Praise Band and Bell Choir. The service was followed by a light lunch, fellowship and a chance to view memorabilia from the past 150 years.



America is **Squandering Our** Grandchildren's **Future**

Many of us sense our great nation — that City upon a Hill — is slipping down the slope, yet we're not sure how to restrain the slide.

Our democratic process is wonderful, yet not perfect. For example, frequent elections combined with candidates who think the fate of the Western World rides on their personal re-election — induce politicians to focus laser-like on shortterm gratification, their own and that of the voters. There is no political benefit, indeed there are costs, in thinking about the world our grandchildren will inherit.

Our political campaigns are rife with claims of leadership qualities, yet elected officials are really followers, not leaders, as maybe they should be in a democracy. Candidates pore over opinion polls to learn what they can talk about to curry voter favor, and what they must avoid.

The really tough, fundamental issues are rarely on America's radar screen, among them the following:

Social Security and Medicare. In a few years, both will run out of the money to pay full claims. Modest tweaking of the taxes and benefits could assure a future for both.

Debt. The recent federal tax cut for you and me is paid for almost dollar for dollar with \$1.5 trillion in debt, piled atop many other trillions.

K-12 education. We talk about this endlessly, yet we ignore the imperative to lengthen the school day and year, and replace the long summer break with several shorter breaks throughout the year as in other developed nations and China.

Higher education. According to the College Board, per student spending by state and local governments declined by 15 percent in real terms between 2000 and 2017, while student debt soared.

Health care. Expenditures have increased from 5 percent of GDP in 1960 to near 20 percent of a much larger real GDP today. Our governments have shifted spending from seed corn functions like higher education to meet health care costs, which are disproportionately claimed by old codgers like me. We are robbing young Peter to pay old Paul.

Health. We couldn't have fought World War II

with today's young, of whom fewer than 3 in 10 can meet armed services standards, according to Pentagon data reported in the Wall Street Journal. Related, obesity is an expensive epidemic, pumping diabetes rates sky high.

Personal accountability and family disarray. Our well-intentioned welfare programs require nothing in return from recipients, such as parent training, and dampen initiative. In my rural Illinois setting, Government has too often replaced Dad.

What to do?

A new political party, maybe the Party for the Common Good; we may be individualist by nature, but we're all in this together. The two major parties are bankrupt. The Democratic Party offers little but identity hand-wringing and more spending; the GOP, more tax cuts paid with debt.

The Republican Party started out as a third party, and Lincoln won the presidency with just 39 percent of the vote. I think a plurality of voters would resonate to the call to address tough, even uncomfortable, baseline issues.

A national spreadsheet (today's term is "dashboard") that annually tracks and puts in our faces the trend lines of our progress or decline on issues such as those above. The Party for the Common Good could take the lead in this, as part of its focus on the future.

A civic Great Awakening, similar to the rousing religious awakenings that swept our new nation in the early 19th Century and transformed lives. I call on leading groups across the spectrum such as the conservative Heritage Foundation, the League of Women Voters and the AFI-CIO to rise up in coalition and lead the charge.

I worry readers might smile at my musings, as if our situation is beyond resolve. Yet, absent action on the fundamental problems, I worry about the future of our City upon a Hill, and of our grandchildren.

A Forecast To Be Grateful For

As we go to press this Thursday morning, the National Weather Service is forecasting showers, mainly before 10AM. A chance for a "poor man's car wash" and to get the salt off the family flivver. Temperatures are expected to reach about 54 degrees by 11AM. A good time to check and/or put air in your tires before it turns cold again.

Friday, when this newspaper hits the streets and you are reading this, sunny skies are expected, but temperatures will only reach a high of 37 degrees. Highs will be in the low 40s over the weekend, and our next chance of rain or snow will be Monday night.

Partly sunny and 63 in Santa Monica, California. Surf's up, dude!. Grab your board!

For over a century, the National Weather Service has been providing Americans with a weather forecast. These weather forecasts are created by professional meteorologists who are employed by the US Government. In more recent times, an up-to-the-minute, county-by-county forecast is available on demand at weather. gov. Unlike the commercial sites, that site does not try to sell you umbrellas or snowshoes, nor does it report to marketing companies that you are obsessed with the weather in Honolulu. (Scattered showers, breezy and 85.)

While weather forecasts make life convenient and promote commerce, they also save countless lives. Blizzard, tornado and hurricane warnings give people a chance to prepare and ride out the storm safely. Red flag warnings advise us when the potential for fire is great and to use extra caution.

We tease our weather forecasters mercilessly. They remain good sports as we accuse them of raining on our picnics, giving us snowless Christmases and dumping an unspeakable amount of snow on us during the rest of the winter. We complain that they schedule rain every weekend and gorgeous weather on Mondays. Thank you for abiding our humor.

It isn't easy to become a meteorologist. You have to study lots of science and advanced mathematics. You need a solid background in advanced computing. Many in the field have a graduate-level degree. Like Barbie says, "Math is hard." Unlike the chipper weather presenters on television, most meteorologists toil in obscurity, and aren't all that well-paid. Competition for the best positions in the field is stiff.

The tremendous professionalism of the men and women of the National Weather Service was on display earlier this year when the meteorologists were expected to work during the 35-day government shutdown, yet had their paychecks delayed by the political posturing of Donald J. Trump.

At the beginning of this past September, the Weather Service was trying to warn Floridians and those living further north along the Eastern Seaboard of the threat of Hurricane Dorian. Dorian was the strongest Atlantic hurricane ever to make landfall, and devastated the Bahamas. The threat posed by the storm was grave.

Unable to resist the limelight, Donald J. Trump insisted on using Twitter to issue his own storm warnings. President Trump misspoke and included the State of Alabama in his warning. The Birmingham office of the National Weather Service immediately issued a clarification that Dorian was not a threat to Alabama.

President Trump refused to acknowledge his error (which could have easily been dismissed with a quick apology). Because Donald J. Trump is never wrong, under the orders of Chief of Staff Mick Mulvaney, Secretary of Commerce Wilbur Ross forced the issuance of an unsigned statement on September 6, supporting Donald J. Trump's tweet that Alabama had indeed been in Hurricane Dorian's potential path.

A ridiculous, homemade map was prepared, purporting to show that Alabama had been threatened by Hurricane Dorian. Everyone who saw the map instantly recognized that it was obviously contrived. Graphically demonstrating the extent of his uncontrolled narcissism, President Trump made a fool of himself by endorsing the map as legitimate and displayed it publicly.

We want to emphasize that this editorial isn't about Donald J. Trump and his ego. That was well-documented a very long time ago. It's about the National Weather Service Meteorologists and their hard work on our behalf. Science trumped politics, and we're proud of you.

This Thanksgiving, we salute and thank the meteorologists of the National Weather Service for their service. We would like all of you--and particularly those of you in Birmingham and our local office in Romeoville--to know that you have our support and sincere appreciation for the fine job that you do.

Senate President Cullerton to retire

Senate President John Cullerton will resign from the General Assembly sometime in January, he told his caucus in a meeting after the fall veto session concluded Thursday. A definitive date has not been set.

The Chicago Democrat spent almost 40 years in the General Assembly, first serving in the House before moving to the Senate. He was elected president of that chamber in 2009, and one of his tasks was presiding over the impeachment trial of former Gov. Rod Blagojevich.

"I've had the pleasure to work with a body of Senate members who were equally resolute in moving Illinois forward and making the changes necessary to grow our economy and build a better future for our children and our communities," Cullerton said in a statement.

"I look forward to watching this august chamber and all you will accomplish," he continued. "As we all know, there will be bumps in the road, but they will be paved over with new ideas and solutions, and a constantly changing body of members who are eager to bring their own vision and signature to our illustrious Illinois Senate."

Democratic Gov. J.B. Pritzker said he was "surprised" by the news. Cullerton is his senator.

As of 5:30 p.m. Thursday, he had not had a chance to speak to the Senate president "personally," but Pritzker said he is "very sorry to see him leave his position."

"I've known him for a number of years," he said on his way out of the Statehouse. "I'm especially grateful for his having worked together with me in partnership with so many other members to get our agenda passed in the Legislature this year."

Asked if he would play any role in finding a new leader for the chamber, the governor said he "hadn't thought about it."

In a statement, Cullerton pointed to a list he could "humbly brag" about accomplishing during his tenure: "two capital bills, marriage equality, abolished the death penalty, school funding reform (and) immigration reform."

He has been a champion of anti-tobacco legislation during his time in the General Assembly. Most recently, he is sponsoring a bill that would ban flavored electronic smoking devices. He also supported a law raising the minimum age to purchase nicotine products, banning smoking from public spaces and raising the usage tax on tobacco products.

Cullerton also worked on highway safety laws, including helping to make Illinois the second state to pass a passenger safety and seat belt statute.

Senate Minority Leader Bill Brady, from Bloomington, said Cullerton served the chamber with "honor and distinction."

"I have known John for many years, but it has been during the last two years ... that I have seen firsthand the integrity, honesty, and humor that he brought to the responsibilities his office entailed," he said in a statement. "We may not have always agreed on how best to address the issues facing the state, but there can be no denying John always put the people of Illinois first."


The Senate president's announcement comes in the wake of calls for ethics reforms in the Legislature and two of his caucus members being embroiled in federal legal

The Statehouse office and home of Sen. Martin Sandoval, D-Chicago, were raided in September by federal officials. No charges have been filed against him.

And federal embezzlement charges were filed against Sen. Tom Cullerton, from Villa Park. He has pleaded not guilty, and is a distant cousin of John Cullerton.

The Senate president is an attorney, and a partner at the law firm Thompson Coburn, according to his website.
