
For those who have won, the only thing better than winning a blue ribbon is a best in show rosette.

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#### "We have a seat for you"

### **Covered Watergate Hearings Nixon Resigned** 45 Years Ago Friday

The darkest chapter in American political history is Watergate, a two-year saga that brought down a presidency. It remains the standard by which all other Washington scandals are judged.

Friday (Aug. 9) marks the 45th anniversary of the resignation of President Richard Nixon in 1974, bringing an end to an ordeal that rocked the nation's confidence in its leaders. An Illinois man had a front-row seat for the Congressional hearings that led to Nixon's downfall.

"My feeling was that I was an up-close witness to unprecedented political history in the United States," said Taylor Pensoneau, who covered the hearings for the St. Louis Post-Dispatch. "I was fully aware of what was transpiring, and that I was covering it."

At the time, Pensoneau was a 33-year-old political writer for the Post-Dispatch who was based in the press room of the Illinois statehouse.

A Belleville native, he spent much of the summers of 1973 and 1974 in the paper's Washington bureau with Lawrence Taylor, regular national а political writer for the Post. Pensoneau now lives in New Berlin, Ill., twenty miles west of Springfield.

The scandal was rooted in a breakin on June 17, 1972 at the Democratic National Committee headquarters at the Watergate complex in Washington - hence the name of the saga.

The bumbling episode led to the arrest of five burglars, and touched off sweeping а investigation by Washington Post reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein. In February 1973, the Senate voted 77-0 to create a committee for its own examination.

The seven-man Senate Watergate Committee convened on May 17, 1973 and was headed by Sam Ervin (D-N.C.), with Howard Baker (R-Tenn.) as the ranking minority member. Baker would later utter the famous words "What did the

President know, and when did he know it?," while the unshakable Ervin became famous for his downhome manner and bushy eyebrows that raised at every key point.

All three major networks and PBS broadcast 319 hours of the hearings, which were viewed by at least 85 percent of American households. National Public Radio and countless other radio outlets also relayed coverage to a public riveted by the proceedings.

Pensoneau and the Post-Dispatch were assigned a choice seat near the witnesses, and he encountered some rising stars. Among them was Lesley Stahl, a future CBS News reporter and 60 Minutes contributor.

"Her role in covering the Watergate hearings lifted her to prominence," recalled Pensoneau. "She acutally covered for me when I would step out to phone updates to the home office, in St. Louis.'

Nixon's clashes with the media were welldocumented, and that antagonism permeated much of the coverage of the hearings.

"The writers were like sharks, and Nixon's blood was in the water," said Pensoneau. "They were deadset on eating him alive.

"I didn't find a lot of objective reporting on the part of some in covering Watergate," continued

Pensoneau. "I tried to be balanced in my articles, since I didn't share those feelings. But there was an intense hatred by the press for Nixon."

Among the myriad of memorable moments in the Senate Committee was the testimony of Nixon's deputy chief of staff, Alexander Butterfield, on July 16, 1973, in which he revealed that the President had installed a taping system in the Oval Office. The Senate hearings concluded in August 1973, and the committee issued an exhaustive 1,250-page report on June 27, 1974.

In May 1974, the House Judiciary Committee, chaired by Rep. Peter Rodino (D-N.J.), began its own hearings on impeachment. Again, Pensoneau covered the hearings, where he encountered a young Yale law graduate in Hillary Rodham. "She was а Democratic operative who was responsible for researching impeachment procedures," remarked Pensoneau. "I wasn't around her very much." She married future President Bill Clinton the following year.

That July 27, Pensoneau and Taylor were seated in Room 2141 of the Rayburn House Office Building to cover the committee's vote on articles of impeachment. The first article, a charge of obstruction of justice, passed 27-11, with six Republicans joining 21 Democrats in favor.

Pensoneau and Taylor shared the byline covering the vote in the next morning's Post-Dispatch. Pensoneau later called it "undoubtedly the biggest byline of my newspaper years."

The committee subsequently voted to approve two more articles of impeachment. Nixon, though, avoided a certain removal from office with his resignation on Aug. 9, 1974.


His successor, President Gerald Ford, later granted a full pardon to Nixon in an effort to put Watergate behind the nation. Still, the scandal stuck to Nixon until his death on April 22, 1994.

Pensoneau remained with the Post-Dispatch through 1978. Forty-five years later, he remains awestruck at his experiences during Watergate.

"I always think back to how I was this kid from Belleville who started out as a paperboy, and I ended up right there, in the middle of the hearings, among a limited number of reporters," he reflected.

"I was there as they voted to impeach the President of the United States. For a political reporter, it can't get much better than that."

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

### **Feds: State Senator Collected Pay And Benefits for 'Little** or No Work'

An Illinois state senator was formally accused of collecting a salary as well as health and pension benefits from a labor union "for which he did little or no work" by a federal grand jury Friday in Cook County.

Villa Park Democrat Tom Cullerton, who has served in the General Assembly since January 2013, is charged with 40 counts in an indictment alleging he "knowingly conspire(d)" to embezzle from the Teamsters Joint Council 25 and Teamsters Local Union 734 Unions. Cullerton is also facing one count alleging he lied on health forms.

John Theis, the senator's attorney, said in an emailed statement to the Chicago Tribune that the allegations against Cullerton are "simply not true, and we will be defending the charges in court."

"As an honorably discharged veteran of the United States Army and highly respected public servant, Tom Cullerton is a person who is dedicated to his family, constituents, and all Illinoisans," Theis said in the statement. "The action by the U.S. Department of Justice has nothing to do with Mr. Cullerton's work in the Illinois State Senate, but is the result of false claims by disgraced Teamsters boss John Coli in an apparent attempt to avoid penalties for his wrongdoing."

Theis is married to Illinois Supreme Court Justice Mary Jane Theis.

The federal government, in court documents,

claims the senator's purported actions caused the union to lose \$274,066 from January 2013 through February 2016 \$188,320 in salary and allowances; \$64,068 in medical and pension contributions; plan and \$21,678 in "reimbursed medical claims."

According to the indictment, Cullerton also received holiday bonuses for three years, and collected about \$60,000 from was hired as a union organizer, according to court documents. That position was a full-time one that came with health and pension benefits.

The indictment alleges the senator "was doing little or no work for Teamsters Joint Council 25 during each pay period he was paid full-time salary as an organizer," even though he "was paid a monthly car and telephone allowance."

Those full-time wages continued while Cullerton fulfilled his obligations as a state senator, the court documents continue.

He was hired to the union position by John Coli, the former union leader who recently agreed to work with federal prosecutors as part of a plea deal. Coli said in federal court he was guilty of extorting a film studio in Chicago.

Cullerton reported the additional income in a Statement of Economic Interests form with the secretary of state's office, as required by Illinois law, in 2013 and 2014 but not in 2015 or 2016, according to the indictment.

"This is clearly part of an ongoing investigation," John Patterson, spokesperson for Senate President John Cullerton, said in an emailed statement. "The senate president reminds everyone we have a system of justice that presumes everyone innocent until proven otherwise."

The senate president, a Democrat from Chicago, is a distant cousin of Sen. Tom Cullerton.

Federal prosecutors submitted a document asking that if Cullerton is found guilty of the charges against him, he should have to pay back \$274,066, which they allege is traceable to the alleged offenses.

Rep. Grant Wehrli, a Naperville Republican, called on Cullerton to resign.

"If true, his actions were highly illegal and completely unbecoming of the office he holds," Wehrli said in a statement. "Ethical behavior is not a partisan issue. Members of both parties should be denouncing this type of conduct. I ask all Illinois lawmakers, both Republicans and Democrats, to join me in calling for Senator Cullerton's resignation."

Rep. Mart Batinick, a Republican from




Plainfield, had a different take.
